You will have a particular focus on connecting schools and young people to our world class exhibition programme. This will include promoting and organising school sessions, managing the Portfolio art competition, and assisting on exhibition development and public programming.

Working collaboratively with colleagues across the organisation, part of your role will be inputting into our future learning programme to help deliver our learning strategy, working with the local community to develop collaborative programmes. Your role will involve working closely with the learning team to develop sessions and physical and digital learning resources for a range of audiences.

Principal Duties/Tasks and responsibilities

• Developing, planning, managing and delivering a creative programme of learning events and activities that support the exhibition programme.

- Effectively managing all event staff, volunteers and contractors during events
- Running training and developing working relationships with Engagement Assistants and artists who support the delivery of the learning programme
- Effectively managing budgets, ticketing, bookings and income for learning programmes
- Identifying and developing relationships and collaborations with key external organisations which support the public programme
- Fostering strong relationships with local community groups to collaboratively develop programmes that help engage local audiences
- Develop the school's programme by consulting with teachers
- Manage the gallery's competitions aimed at schools and families
- Assist with areas of the wider programme, working collaboratively with colleagues across the organisation.
- Disseminate programmes to peers both internally and externally through publications, conferences and relevant networks
- Ensure effective reporting, monitoring and evaluation of all learning events and activities
- Developing learning resources to support the public programme
- Liaising closely with the development team to ensure project funders are kept well informed about progress. Where appropriate contribute to funding applications.
- Taking care of your personal health and safety and that of others and report any health and safety concerns. Ensuring proactive compliance with Turner Contemporary H&S policy, including risk assessments and implementing safe systems of work.
